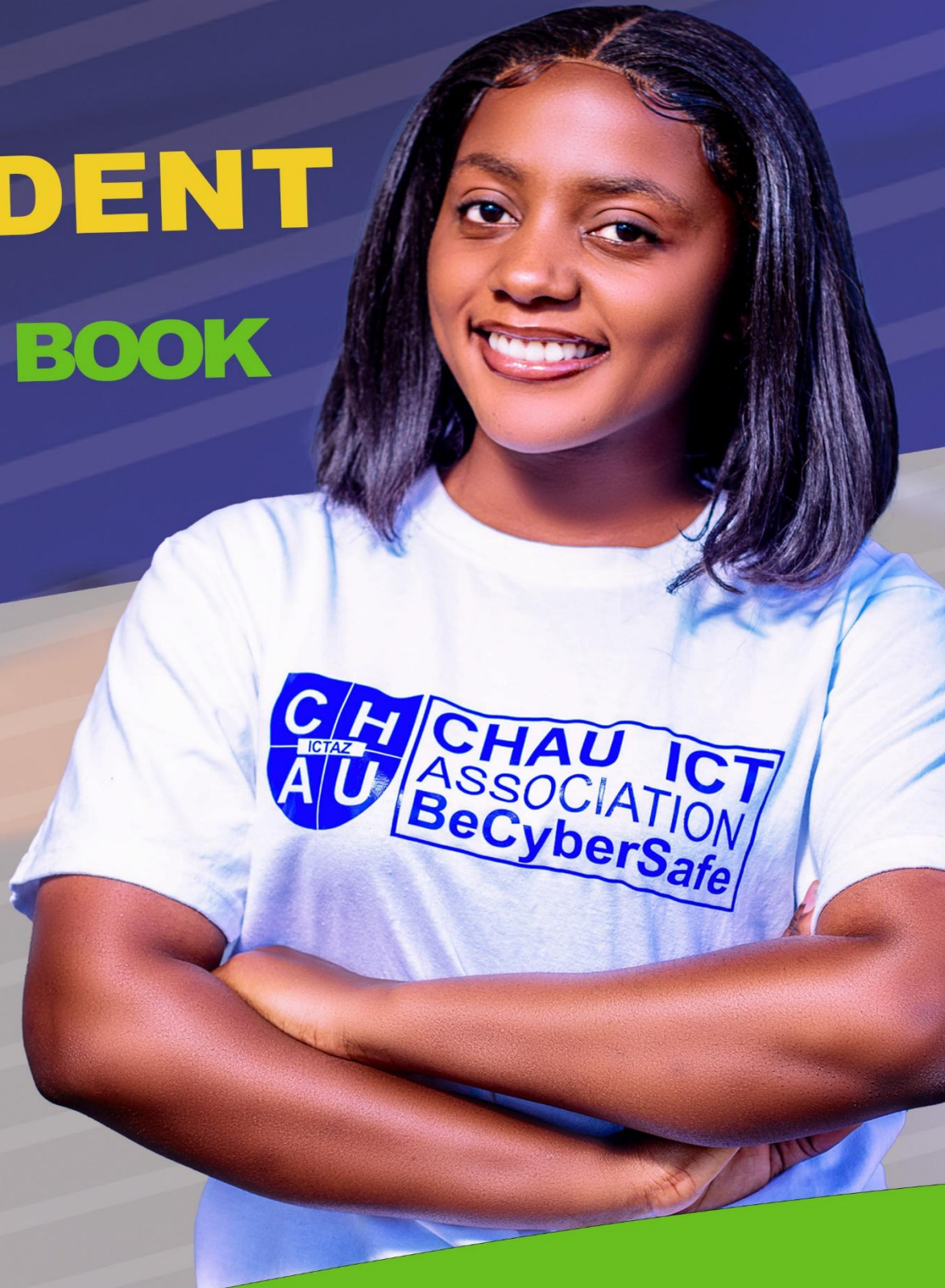

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INTRODUCTION

This is your University Student Handbook. The information provided in this handbook sets the foundation for a positive, healthy, inclusive, and responsible campus experience that gives you the opportunity to realize your potential and fulfill your educational goals. I urge you to spare some time to familiarize yourself with the information, expectations, policies, and procedures.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Chalimbana University was born from the original Jeanes School which was opened in 1939, as a Jeanes Training Centre for community teachers. It is located 57 km east of Lusaka in Chongwe district. In the 1950s the college was affiliated to the University of Salisbury – Southern Rhodesia as Chalimbana Teacher Training College; training both primary and secondary school teachers.

The college became exclusively in-service in 1970 to service primary school teachers and administrators and was renamed National In-service Teachers College NISTCOL. In 1975 Advanced Primary Course (APC) and Advanced Industrial Arts (AIA) was introduced. These were upgrading courses for primary school teachers who had the necessary school certificate qualifications. These were one-year courses. In 1989 Diploma in Basic Education for Science, Mathematics and English were introduced which was later in 1995 affiliated to the University of Zambia under the name of Secondary Teachers' Diploma. In 2005 Diploma in Education Management by distance learning was introduced.

NISTCOL was pronounced a university by the Zambian government in 2011, but transformation into Chalimbana University in 2013 through the statutory instrument Number 111 of 2013. This was followed by the inauguration of Chalimbana University Council by the then Education Minister, in the same year. Currently Chalimbana University has seven schools which are offering teaching and non-teaching courses. Chalimbana university is determined from its motto, service, integrity and excellence to graduate students that will be self-dependent for the benefit of their societies.

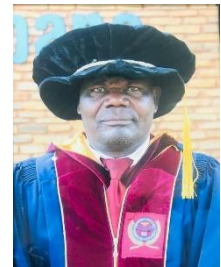

- Those with a certificate will enter at second year provided it is in the same field.
- Credit transfer will only be considered if the transcript of results at year one or two is certified by the transferring institution. Actual grades will be transferred to Chalimbana
- Chalimbana University shall accept attainment arising from prior certificated learning, either awarded by itself or another institution. The courses to be recognised shall be limited to 1st and 2nd year. These shall be subject to exemptions on proof of production of equivalent academic qualifications as determined by Schools.

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION



ACCOMMODATION FOR FULLTIME STUDENTS

As a new student you will be required to apply online for accommodation upon receipt of an admission letter. If the university space is not enough you can source outside campus from a number of boarding houses around near the institutions. If you are a returning student, you will maintain your room until you complete your studies.

ACCOMMODATION FOR DISTANCE STUDENTS

- The University will provide accommodation to Distance Education students during the residential school.
- Students who may become pregnant during their study period will lose accommodation and may reapply after maternity leave.

The University will not provide:

- Hostel facilities for couples and families.
- Students wishing to come with their babies are advised to make private arrangements off campus.

CHALIMBANA UNIVERSITY MALE HOSTELS

The university has 4 hostels for male students namely:

- C with 24 rooms each x 2 banker beds each room

- N with 24 rooms each x 2 banker beds each room
- B with 23 rooms by 2 banker beds each room
- R, with 25 rooms with 2 banker beds each room

CHALIMBANA UNIVERSITY FEMALE HOSTELS

The university has 6 female hostels namely:

- ADB1 with 16 rooms by 2 banker beds each room
- ADB2 with 16 rooms by 2 banker beds each room
- K with 16 rooms of which room 1, 2, 15, and 16 have 2 banker beds and the rest have 3 banker beds
- Z with 16 rooms of which room 1, 2, 15 and 16 have 2 banker beds and the rest have 3 banker beds
- L with 16 rooms of which room 1 is a matron's office then 2, 15 and 16 have 2 banker beds and the rest have 3 banker beds

The university has 3 kitchennets for male students and 7 for ladies. Cooking is not allowed in the rooms as such you are required to do your cooking in the kitchennets

HEALTH

Chalimbana University does not have a clinic for the institution but they use Chalimbana clinic and it is functional 24hours service. Currently the sick bay is under construction.

SERVICES OFFERED TO STUDENTS BY THE CLINIC

- General medical examination and treatment
- HIV and other sexually transmitted testing
- HIV counseling
- Hepatitis rapid testing
- Tuberculosis sputum testing
- SD4 Count testing
- Viral load testing
- Malaria testing both rapid and slide testing
- Anti-viral treatment

- Birth control services
- Condom distribution
- Cervical cancer screening
- Antenatal clinic services

OTHER SERVICES OFFERED BY THE CLINIC TO PROMOTE STUDENTS HEALTH

- The environmental health technicians go round to access the environment the students stay in and if conditions are bidding the health inspectors will be informed.
- The community health assistants go round to identify new disease out breaks and other health related issues such as sexually transmitted, HIV for the students who are shy and do not want to be seen at the clinic. They also assist in distributing condoms.

PROCEDURE FOLLOWED WHEN A STUDENT GETS SICK

When students get sick and are able to walk they go to Chalimbana clinic,

When a student gets very sick they report to the block mayor who will call the maroon or any of the Assistant Deans of Student Affairs who then informs the driver, the student is then taken to the Chalimbana clinic and if the condition is critical the clinic will refer the patient to Chongwe hospital and if the condition is beyond they will further refer the patient to either Levy Mwanawasa or University Teaching Hospital (UTH)

OTHER HEALTH CONCERNS

- Sick Students wishing admission in other health facilities will do so at their own cost
- Any student suffering from any infectious disease shall be required to inform the Dean of students in confidence
- Students may be required to notify the Dean of students any illness or disability
- Students may be required to undergo medical examination whenever the Dean of students finds it necessary.

ABOUT OUR LIBRARY

Chalimbana University Library provides support to the academic welfare and research activities of its patrons. It has enough information specialists who are highly skilled in providing quality service to the community.

COLLECTION

Our general collection covers a wide range of relevant information materials in various disciplines offered by the university. In addition to the general stacks of information materials, we have a special collection as well as short loan for reference materials that can only be used within the library (these are materials that are on demand) and reference services. Furthermore, we have a digital library where our patrons can access electronic resources and open access materials such as books and journals to meet their research needs.

The library has a computer lab with computers connected to reliable internet and free Wi-Fi for patrons to use.

OPERATING HOURS

In the quest to serve our patrons better, we have extended our operating hours as follows:

- **MONDAY TO FRIDAY 08:00 HOURS– 22:00 HOURS**
- **SATURDAY AND SUNDAY 09:00HOURS – 16:00 HOURS**

SECURITY

Chalimbana university has less cases of theft due to security measures put in place. Below are some of the measures that Chalimbana University has put in place:

SECURITY COMPANY

Chalimbana university has a security company. It has security personnel at the main entrance to be aware of people who are entering the university through the main entrance. Personnel has also been put in and strategic points such as near the library car park, near the garden, at the graduation square, hostels throughout that is day and night.

POLICE POST

The university has a post which handles issues of security which cannot be handled by the security company. The police post is functional 24 hours that is day and night

SECURITY MEASURES IN HOSTEL ROOMS

The rooms are locked when the occupants are not there and keys are secured by the students allocated to that particular. When students close the keys are handed over to the hostel attendant

and he or she will hand them in to the matron who will keep. Names and contacts of the room occupants are recorded. Keys for the rooms are labelled.

FINANCIAL HELP FOR VULNERABLE STUDENTS

The Dean of Students' office in collaboration with the registrar will coordinate the recruitment process. Students will have to apply to the DOSA office when vacancies are advertised.

Employment in this case is temporal and if students want to be engaged at a later time, they will be required to reapply.

Only students who are fully registered will be considered for temporal employment.

Student who graduate, leave school, or fail to meet registration requirements will lose eligibility for student employment. Students who lose employment eligibility will immediately have their employment status terminated.

The Student is supposed to work for 8 hours per day during the period of engagement.

Pay rate adjustments will be determined from time to time by the DOSA and University management.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

These general Rules and Regulations apply to all students registered at Chalimbana University.

All students are expected to conduct themselves in a mature and responsible manner. The following shall be considered as action, omission or conduct contrary to these Rules and Regulations and shall be regarded as misconduct.

DISCIPLINARY CASES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DEAN OF STUDENTS

All students' disciplinary cases occurring in units other than schools and library shall be dealt with by the Students Disciplinary Committee. Students should consult other units for rules applicable to in those units.

1.	Willful or negligent damage to/or loss to furniture, windows, doors, beddings, curtains and any other fitting in the study room (hostels).	A fine commensurate with the cost of redressing the damage shall be imposed.
2.	Willful or negligent loss of keys.	Any loss of room keys should be reported immediately to the Dean of Students and attract a penalty fee of K200.00.
3.	Unauthorized removal or loss of University furniture, fitting and beds and mattresses from the rooms without prior permission from the Dean of Students office	First offender; verbal warning f and payment of the replacement value of the item. Second offender payment of the replacement value of the item and suspension from the Hostels for one academic year.
4.	Cooking in hostel rooms is totally prohibited except in designated areas (e.g. Kitchenettes)	Offenders face loss of accommodation instantly for one academic year.
5.	Staying in the hostels whilst pregnant at an advanced stage is not allowed.	Forfeiture of bed space. Expectant mothers should be encouraged to make their own conducive accommodation arrangement.
6.	Bringing personal items such as beds, mattresses, lockers, fridges and furniture into the Halls of residence without prior written permission from the Dean of Students	Forfeiture of the said item(s) to the University.
7.	Conducting of any form of business around the hostels and the University as a whole.	Offenders face loss of accommodation instantly for one academic year.
8.	Calling for, organizing and or conducting meetings/parties without the prior permission of the Dean of Students office	The student shall be suspended from the University for one academic year.
9.	Unauthorized possession of a key to University property	The student shall be suspended for one academic year

10.	Failure to hand in room keys, mattresses and any other hostel properties /items upon closure of the University	The student shall be suspended from University for one academic year.
11.	Illegal occupation of a bed space	The students shall pay for the bed space for the number of days he/she will be in the study room at rate of K100.00 per day.
12.	Any disorderly conduct such as; bullying, selfish use of television or any other music system at all times and any other behaviour causing a nuisance, inconvenience or annoyance to other students and staff.	First offender; verbal warning Second offender; confiscating of the music system. Third offender; suspension from the hostels for one academic year.
13.	Allowing people from outside or being in possession of drugs as well as consuming and selling of the said.	The student shall be expelled from the University and reported to relevant authorities for prosecution in respect of drugs.
14.	Smoking around campus.	The students shall be suspended from hall of residence for one academic year.
15.	Change of accommodation without prior written permission from the Dean of Students' office.	The student shall be suspended from the halls of residence for one academic year.
16.	Keeping a visitor or friend, either male or female in the study room overnight.	The student shall be suspended from hall of residence for one academic year.
17.	Personal beds, mattresses, lockers, fixtures and fittings such as mortise locks or socket outlets brought into hostels of residence without prior permission from the Dean of Students. Appropriate consent forms shall be filled in each time these are brought in.	The student who brings in any personal items without prior authorisation, shall forfeit the items and be suspended from the hostel for one term
